Licences and certifications must also be forwarded well in advance to the Guatemalan authorities.

“No access to surgery see millions dying”

A large majority of people in the world do not have access to safe and affordable surgery, according to a new report. An estimated five billion people, from a total population of seven billion, are unable to get surgical help when they need it, said researchers.

In low and middle-income countries as many as nine out of 10 individuals were said to lack basic surgical care. As a result, millions of people were dying needlessly from common and easily treated conditions such as appendicitis, fractures, and childbirth complications.

Researcher Andy Leather, director of the King’s Centre for Global Health at King’s College London, said: “In the absence of surgical care, common, easily treatable illnesses become fatal. The global community cannot continue to ignore this problem – millions of people are already dying unnecessarily, and the need for equitable and affordable access to surgical services is projected to increase in the coming decades, as many of the worst affected countries face rising rates of cancer, cardiovascular disease, and road accidents.”

Of the 313 million operations performed around the world each year, just one in 20 takes place in the poorest countries.

Mission Costs and Your Donation



Medicos en Accion originated in Kamloops, BC where most of the organization's executive members and many of volunteers still live and work. Traditionally, community fundraisers were held to raise money to cover the costs of medications and supplies and the Kamloops group continue to do this in support of The Gambia missions. The Guatemala surgical group, however, is made up of volunteers from across Canada and the U.S. and it has not yet been possible to work together on a major fundraising effort.

In addition to the in-country personal mission expenses (accommodation, ground transfers, and meals at the hospital), each participant also makes a donation to offset the costs associated with providing surgical services in Antigua. These costs generally include: medications, surgical supplies, IV fluids and accommodation for patients who must travel from other parts of the country for surgery. While many volunteers now consider this part of their overall trip cost, participants are encouraged to fundraise to cover the individual donation portion of their expense.

As challenging as fundraising may seem to be, there are definite advantages to raising funds in support of Medicos missions, including raising the profile of Medicos in your community and potentially attracting future volunteers. Some successful fundraising events have included the sale of Guatemalan crafts, asking friends and family to contribute to
