### **Planning update for future Guatemala missions**

So many of our volunteers are missing their connection to the work we do, the Guatemalan people we interact with and serve, as well as the beautiful country itself! While we have not been able to travel to Guatemala this year, we have continued to support the operations of Hermano Pedro Hospital through our recent fundraising campaign.

More than half of Guatemala's 16 million people live in poverty and the pandemic has made the situation even more precarious for many. Those who enjoy regular employment often support many family members, either directly or indirectly. With this in mind, we focused our recent fundraising on supporting Hermano Pedro Hospital's surgical program staff. Together we raised over \$18,000 CDN and earlier this month sent \$14,640 USD for this purpose. The funds have been gratefully received and the Obras organization sent the attached thank you letter. Thank you to all who so generously contributed! If you would still like to make a donation, here's how:

- Go to the Medicos en Accion website (medicos-en-accion.com), select "Donations" from the vertical menu bar at the left and go to the bottom of the page for the Canada Helps donation form (this may take a minute or so to load).
- Under "Fund" on the form, use the drop-down menu to select"7. Hermano Pedro Support" and;
- **3**. Complete the rest of the form to make your donation.

A tax receipt will be e-mailed from Canada Helps within hours of your donation.

Our teams will return to Guatemala when it is safe and practicable to do so. Based on what we know as of now, we remain optimistic that we'll return to Antigua in 2022 as scheduled. The first US teams are scheduled to return to Antigua in May and earlier this month, a Guatemalan team provided cleft lip and palate surgeries at Hermano Pedro Hospital.

It may be possible for a small ENT and Hearing Clinic team to provide services at Hospital Shalom in the Petén towards the end of this year. We can expect that our next missions will be at a higher cost and, because of restrictions, will serve fewer patients.

Some of the criteria we are monitoring to ensure the safe return of volunteers to Guatemala include:

- Government travel advisories and requirements (Canada, USA, and Guatemala) for pre and post-travel testing, self-isolation, vaccination status;
- Flight availability and cost;
- Accommodation and in-country transportation challenges;
- Procurement of needed PPE supplies;
- COVID sanitizing requirements during clinics and between surgical cases.

As well, we will need to develop contingency plans for different aspects of the missions. Your Medicos en Accion, Guatemala Surgery leadership team is committed to doing this work over the next months.
