Antigua Report

Thanks to the generous support of our volunteers and donors, we had another successful mission to Antigua! The team utilized the 4 operating rooms to perform 183 surgical procedures for 138 individual patients:

General Surgery completed 22 procedures

Gynecology completed 60 procedures

ENT completed 57 procedures.

This year we had gynecology surgery through the second week so fewer ENT cases were scheduled.

Our team had the opportunity to again share in the capacity and cost of a shipping container to Guatemala in August 2019. We shipped an increased supply of drapes and gowns this year to try to provision for two years and decrease shipping costs to every second year. As a higher number of gynecology surgeries were performed this year, the team will need to purchase and transport some gynecology drapes for the 2021 mission. We are again grateful to Dr. Joe Delvicario of Health for Humanity who organized the purchase of these supplies through St. Paul's Hospital in Vancouver and provided a location for us to drop off several boxes of supplies provided again this year by the Compassionate Resource Warehouse (Victoria, B.C.).

Hearing Clinic:

Working with a single audiologist, the team was able to see 87 patients in the clinic, conduct hearing tests with 44 patients, fit 29 new hearing aids, provide 18 new molds, repair and program 45 hearing aids of repeat patients, and refer 15 patients to Otolaryngology for medical consultation.

For several years the Audiology program at the University of Washington undertook to train hearing aid technicians in northern Guatemala. One of the local people they trained has assisted our ENT team in the Petén on two missions. This year the team invited the technician, Oscar Cano, to join our team and work with the Hearing Clinic volunteers in Antigua. Our intent was to support his learning through contact with the audiologist as well as to have him obtain the hearing assessments. This experience was successful and the team looks forward to Oscar joining us in the future.

Planning for the November 2020 mission to San Benito and the 2021 mission to Antigua is underway. We have made a slight change to the fee structure for the Antigua mission as we appreciate many nursing volunteers are concerned about the cost. We have also reduced the application donation amount.

Please note: in the event a Guatemala mission must be canceled because of a Canadian government travel warning about COVID-19, deposits will be refunded

San Benito Adventure

The March mission to San Benito was a very different mission with surprises each day. The team began to travel just as borders began to close. Two members, Murray and Cindy Reimer, never got past Toronto airport. Passengers were removed from the flight as borders closed. (Unfortunately, Canada Customs seized our anaesthesia drugs even though the aircraft never left the Toronto gate. They were considered to be 'importing' drugs.)

With no anaesthetist, but with supplies and medications stored from the earlier mission, the hospital contracted with local anaesthetists for services. This resulted in additional fees charged to patients and a few had to cancel because of the additional cost.

As Guatemala shut down, so did transportation systems. With the combination of no buses running, social distancing and control of numbers, many patients could not access the hospital. Regardless, the team had a very busy ENT and hearing clinic on Sunday. Ninetynine patients were seen in both clinics and 17 surgeries were booked.

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday was also busy with clinic visits after the OR. Norm cleaned and treated many ear infections and other conditions. We also started a list of surgeries for November as we were informed we could not fill the remainder of our list because other surgical groups needed the OR. By Friday, 13 surgeries were completed and 22 hearing aids dispensed.

Departing Flores became a challenge as airlines began cutting service and hotels closed under government orders. Joanne reported that she and Norm's flight was changed five times. However, Friday evening the five team members were able to depart for Guatemala

City and were able to secure seats on a plane dispatched from the US to pick up Americans and, luckily, Canadians.

Despite this, the team reports it was a successful mission. The people in need were served and the hospital staff were very helpful. As a bonus, the weather was beautiful, the sunsets colourful and Flores was quiet and peaceful.

including travel days

Applications are now being accepted for 2021 on a first received basis. This means a fully completed application form, signed waiver, certificates and for physicians, a copy of your degree, specialization certificate and current license. If your license will be renewed after your



application is posted, please send proof of your renewal after you receive it.

Please ensure your application is complete *before* you mail it. Your application must include a cheque for \$250 CDN, payable to *Medicos en Accion* or it will not be considered. If you are <u>not</u> accepted to the team, you will be notified via email and your cheque will be shredded. For those accepted to the mission, the amount will be deducted from your final donation and expense payment.

We regret that because of limited accommodation, friends and family visiting with team members should make their own hotel arrangements.

October 30 - November 6, 2020 (ENT and hearing clinic only) OR and PAR nurses are encouraged to apply. The mission is based in Flores. Application deadline: August 28, 2020

Fundraising for your Medicos mission?
