
What's happening with Guatemala missions?

This is the time of year when in past years a small ENT and Hearing Clinic team would be returning from a mission in the Peten and other volunteers would be working out the details of the upcoming January/February mission to Antigua. The Antigua team volunteers would have been finalized, lists of needed supplies compiled and being purchased, initial orientation materials being sent out, and anticipation and excitement about the mission starting to build. So, it is with a sense of loss that we are unable to travel to Guatemala again this winter to provide much needed services to the Mayan people there, while also renewing ac-

quaintance with our volunteer colleagues and hospital staff from previous missions, meeting new colleagues and friends, and enjoying the beauty of Antiqua.

However, the decision was made for us for 2022 as Hermano Pedro Hospital undertakes an ambitious 3 month project to renovate and expand their operating room, recovery, and convalescent facilities. After a month of site preparation, construction began on November 6th and is expected to be completed by the end of February 2022. They extended their thanks to the visiting teams for the generosity of time, trip fees, supplies, equipment, and general donations that we provide and have asked all teams to consider making a special gift towards this major project. The projected cost of the project is \$821,000 USD or 6 million quetzals. Sixty percent of the cost of the project is being covered through fundraising in Guatemala by the *Friends of Obras Sociales del Santo Hermano Pedro* who run an annual raffle. Obras needs to raise the remaining 40% or \$328,000.


The goal of the *Obras Sociales* is to increase surgeries at Hermano Pedro Hospital from 6,500 annually to 10,000 over the next 3 years. They have pro-



We continue to monitor the situation in Guatemala and to develop and refine the criteria we will use to decide when to return. According to *ourworldindata.org* (accessed Nov. 18, 2021), daily cases in Guatemala peaked in late August at 4,000 and have fallen steadily since then. However, daily testing has also fallen recently. Just over 30% of the population has received a first dose of vaccine and 3.5 million people are fully vaccinated.

"Traveling to an area of low vaccination (and high Covid-19 case rates) is inherently risky...You can control the risk to yourself and the risk to others by ensuring you are vaccinated, wearing masks in appropriate venues, not traveling when symptomatic or if you have a recent exposure and getting tested frequently with antigen tests." Hermano Pedro Hospital shut down completely for 3 months at the start of the pandemic. It gradually reopened starting with outpatient services and is now operating at 75% capacity. Despite the challenges of travel during Covid-19 and significant decrease in visiting medical teams, as of the end of September Hermano Pedro Hospital had hosted 15 international teams in 2021.



Fundraising 2020/2021

Our appeal to Medicos en Accion supporters for donations to support Hermano Pedro OR staff last year raised \$14,605.00 USD that was sent by wire transfer in Frbruary. This donation covered the payroll costs of many employees over 2 months. We received a thank you (see page 3) and a report with copies of the payroll receipts of the employees sponsored, which was signed by the employees.

Looking towards 2022

As costs increase across the board, we know that by the time we are able to return to Guatemala the cost of the medications, anaesthesia, surgical, and hearing clinic supplies will have increased. We've been thinking about planning a unique fundraising event that will allow us to come together virtually. Stay tuned for the email announcement coming soon!
